

PARENTS' ATTITUDES TOWARDS EARLY MARRIAGE

Outcome indicator, Output indicator

Indicator Phrasing

English: % of [select: mothers / fathers] who do not intend to marry their daughter before the age of

French: % de [sélectionner: femmes/ hommes] n'ayant pas l'intention de marier leur fille avant l'âge de 18 ans

Portuguese: % de [selecione: mães / pais] que não pretendem casar a filha antes dos 18 anos

Czech: % [určete: matek / octů] kteří nezamýšlí provdat svoji dceru dříve než ve věku 18 let

What is its purpose?

Girls who marry early frequently abandon formal education and many have early and often high-risk pregnancies. Child brides are also at higher risk of abuse, exploitation, and separation from family and friends, which can all have major consequences on health and wellbeing. This indicator therefore measures the proportion of either fathers or mothers who do not intend to marry their daughters before the age of 18.

How to Collect and Analyse the Required Data

Collect the following data by conducting individual interviews with a <u>representative sample</u> of either fathers or mother of girls aged 10 to 17 years (i.e. less than 18 years).

RECOMMENDED SURVEY QUESTIONS (Q) AND POSSIBLE ANSWERS (A)

Q1: Do you have a daughter aged 10 to 17 years?

A1: yes / no

(ask the following question only if the previous answer is YES)

Q2: Is she already married?

A2: yes / no

(ask the following question only if the previous answer is NO)

Q3 : If you consider your family's situation and the attitudes of different family members, at what age do you think your daughter should get married?
A3:
1) specify the age:
To calculate the indicator's value , divide the number of respondents who either married or intend to marry their daughter before the age of 18 by the total number of respondents with daughter aged 10 to 17 years. Multiply the result by 100 to convert it to a percentage.
Disaggregate by
<u>Disaggregate</u> the data by the respondent's ethnicity, education level, <u>wealth</u> category, and other factors depending on the local context.
